Transforming Lives... Strengthening the Community

During the fiscal year 2017-2018, Assistance League of the Bay Area spent approximately \$280,400 to assist families, adults, children, youth, teens, and seniors in need through its six philanthropic programs and two projects:

- Operation School Bell[®] clothed 2,765 students, pre-K through 12th grade, from four area school districts and a public charter system;
- Operation Cinderella provided prom attire to 127 high school seniors;
- Community Outreach supported innovative classroom techniques for over 900 children by funding teacher grants and delivering over 1,100 award winning books to elementary school campus libraries;
- Operation Support Our Schools provided over \$11,000 in nutritional support for 1,710 at-risk students, funded 29 eye exams and glasses, and over \$10,000 in goods to area students impacted by Hurricane Harvey;
- Assault Survivor Kits[®] donated 295 kits of clothing and care items for victims of sexual assault and domestic violence:
- Ready for Work assisted 15 referred clients in selecting job and interviewappropriate clothing who were reentering the workforce;
- Assistance League's Legacy of Literacy collected and distributed 2,505 books to over 1,200 students; and
- Partnered with Sesame Workshop Hugs For Houston to bring a message of hope and love to students impacted by Hurricane Harvey.

Assistance League of the Bay Area, a chapter of Assistance League, is an all-volunteer IRS 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. One hundred percent (100%) of the dollars raised remain local and support community needs.

Assist-A-Child Cards

Offers designed cards sent to friends, relatives, or business associates, noting a \$25 contribution was given in their name.

Cookbooks

Promotes sales of Settings on the Dock of the Bay and Settings, Sunrise to Sunset, two award-winning cookbooks, that are filled with member-tested recipes and photographs of the Bay Area and are sold in the Resale Shop.

Donations

Relies on grants from foundations and corporate gifts as well as donations, and bequests to boost our ability to serve the community.

Resale Shop

Depends on the public for tax-deductible donations that are sold in Assistance League Resale Shop, our primary source of funding, whose proceeds support our philanthropic programs.

Assisteens®

Assisteens, a chapter auxiliary, consists of students in grades 9 through 12 who actively participate in philanthropic, community, and chapter programs.

Donations Totaling \$3,000 to Operation School Bell

- Birthday-in-a-Box provided 140 birthday party kits to at-risk students along with a small gift and a handwritten card;
- Cause for Paws assembled 325 adoption kits for distribution to new pet owners;
- Operation School Bell Support allowed the teen auxiliary to participate in the chapter's largest philanthropy through a variety of identified activities including the assembly of personal hygiene kits;
- Project Snuggle created 21 fleece blankets which were provided to children who are residents at the Bay Area Turning Point; and
- Notes for Folks designed and shared holiday and birthday cards with senior adults in the memory care unit who reside at Heartls Clear Lake; and
- Implemented a new philanthropic program, Project FAMILY, benefitting young residents at the Bay Area Turning Point with monthly visits focused on learning and fun.
